Beloved Saints of Christ Jesus at Gethsemane Lutheran, Austin:

"And God said, "Let there be light and there was light" Genesis 1:3. "In him was life and the life was the light of humanity. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it" St. John 1:4, 5. Throughout the generations, indeed from the beginning of time, light has been one of the appreciated gifts of God the Creator. The early Christian community developed artistic skills to incorporate light as a means of conveying the Good News of grace and truth in Jesus, the light of the world. Stained glass was one such art form developed by the Church. This combining of glass and light is a subtle skill giving expression to a festival of colors reflecting the beauty of faith and the natural world.

The people of God at Gethsemane took a bold step in the early 1960's in approving plans to build a new place of worship. The concept was to provide a liturgical area manifesting the ancient and modern means of worship. A French artist was commissioned to design a "window wall" of stained glass. This work has been enjoyed for over two decades. In 1984 the congregation approved the completion of the chancel windows requesting the same artist to continue the work.

The stained glass of 1963 and the new glass of 1987 tell the story of our faith. These beautiful windows beg for contemplation and interpretation. They are supported by a building located on a hill overlooking the busy lives of God's people. They are dedicated to the glory of God as an offering to all persons in Austin and throughout the world.

Thanks be to God for the faithfulness of Gethsemane Lutheran members past and present having lived the message of the Christian faith since 1868. We praise God for these windows—symbols of beauty and light—witnessing to the story of God's love in Jesus Christ.

GABRIEL LOIRE

Maître Verrier Peintre

(Master Glassworker and Painter)

resides in Chartres, France. His interest in the restoration of the windows in the cathedral of Angers, France started Loire's work with glass at the age of 21. The 12th century glasswork in the famous Chartres Cathedral heavily influenced Loire's career.

Gethsemane Lutheran Church commissioned Gabriel Loire to create and execute, in glass, the story of the life of Christ. Loire's creation forms the globe of a lantern that is the chancel at Gethsemane. The awesome beauty within is a testament to his master craftsmanship. Thousands of people pass by the lighted lantern each night as it beams the message of Christ, our Savior.

Most stained glass conforms to an existing architectural structure. Loire's stained glass windows become a part of the structure. The architect may design the building to accommodate Loire's work, as Wukasch & Associates did in 1962 at Gethsemane. His creations around the world are so numerous that he has not seen them all. The Kaiser Wilhelm Memorial Church in West Berlin, the Symphony Tower of Joy for Children in Hakone, Japan, and the Salisbury Cathedral in England are examples of his outstanding work.

Loire, at the age of 83, added 128 panels to the existing Gethsemane window. The new designs maintain the brilliant colors contained in the original window. The three walls surrounding the chancel appear as a single stained glass window, with a radiant cross beaming its rays throughout.

Gabriel Loire emphasizes a distinguishing characteristic of his windows. The character of the artwork changes as the position of the sun changes throughout the day and the year. Due to this natural activity, he says, "My windows are alive!"

THE GETHSEMANE STAINED-GLASS WINDOWS

CHRIST'S BIRTH and HIS MINISTRY (East side), CHRIST IN GETHSEMANE (South side), and THE PASSION, GLORIFICATION, and COMMISSIONING OF THE CHURCH (West side) combine to create a 48 foot panorama of 'The Life of Christ.'

Gabriel Loire designed and created *The Gethsemane Window* for Gethsemane Lutheran Church in 1963. The objective, he said, was 'to give a mystical atmosphere so that those who come here have an experience of joy through peace with the window.' He created that atmosphere by using over 150 shades of Chartres' blue with other colors for highlight effects. Pieces of slab glass were hammered and chipped to create the desired multiple facets which refract and capture the sunlight. The faceted glass also increases the intensity of light. The Gethsemane window consists of 90 panels made of glass and concrete. The 36 foot high window weighs approximately 20,000 pounds.

The congregation commissioned the design and creation of additional windows depicting *Christ's Birth* and *His Ministry*, and *The Passion*, *Glorification*, and *Commissioning of the Church*. The completed chancel windows glorified the Risen Lord for the first time on Easter Sunday, 1987.

Loire successfully blended the colors of the new windows with those of the Gethsemane window, creating a brilliant panorama of Christ's life. Technological advances during the last 25 years resulted in the production of stronger and lighter panels. Crushed stone and epoxy replace the heavy, reinforced concrete. Each side wall consists of 64 panels weighing about 5,000 pounds.

Watercolor paintings are completed by Loire for the clerestory, depicting Old Testament scenes on the east side of the sanctuary. The watercolors for the west side outline the development of Christ's church. The creation and installation of the clerestory windows is a challenge for the future. The completion of the chancel windows has made that challenge very real.




3 And, behold, certain of the scribes said within themselves, This man blasphemeth.



10 And straightway coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens opened, and the Spirit like a dove descending upon him:



BAPTISM OF CHRIST





ECCE HOMO (Behold the man!)


Post of the flagellation, crown of thorns and reeds, basin and water (Pontius Pilate)




DISCIPLE OF EMMAUS

ASCENSION


The trace on the ground from the feet of Christ, the ascension

2 And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting.


3 And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them.
